The meeting was called to order by Chairman Kerry Anderson. Wendy moved to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2016 meeting as written. Seconded by Nicole, motion carried.

Financial report was presented. Dennis moved to approve the report, seconded by Nicole. Motion carried.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Committee reports: *Ambassadors* – Most recent visit was to Carrington Inn & Suites to recognize their updates. *Pageant* – Nothing new to report. *Birding Drives Dakota* – We have about 25 registrations in as of today. Festival dates are June 8-12. *Healthy Communities* – Meeting minutes were shared with the board. *Welcome Wagon* – No welcome bags have gone out recently. *Carrington Endowment* – Applications for funding will be accepted now through March 15 for the spring grant round. Two new board members: Pastor Randy Hahne and Heather Carr. *Membership Update* – New individual member: Linda Schuster. Almost all of the 1st quarter renewals are in. *CDC – JDA – CVB* – CDC met on January 27. Dean Pennington has taken the open board position. CVB minutes were shared. *JDA* – Denise and Dennis reported that the JDA met this morning had several topics on the agenda. One being an incentive for daycares and they heard a report on the Service Excellence Program at CHI. *Carrington Garden Club*: Dennis shared information regarding the start-up and progress of the club.
